Terms of Reference

NAME: This Committee shall be called the Advisory Committee on Labour

Relations.

STATUS: The Advisory Committee on Labour Relations is an ad hoc committee of the

Board of Governors.

MANDATE: The purpose of the Committee is to set the mandate for negotiations,

provide guidance and advice and report to the Board of Governors, who

ratify the Collective Agreement.

MEMBERSHIP: The membership of the Committee shall include the following:

Ex officio (voting) Members

- Chair of the Board, who shall act as Chair;
- Vice-Chair of the Board:
- Chair, Finance Committee:
- Chair, Human Resources and Governance Committee

In circumstances where the Vice-Chair of the Board also serves as either Chair of the Finance Committee or Chair of the Human Resources and Governance Committee, the Vice-Chair of that committee shall serve on the ACLR in place of the Chair of that committee as a voting member.

QUORUM: A majority of the voting membership shall constitute quorum.

Governors as required.
